Re-arrange Living Arrangements	Caregivers will assure that all items that could readily be used as weapons (e.g. knives) are not accessible to the child. Caregivers will assure that the child does not share a bedroom with any other children in the home. House rules: • bedtimes will be staggered • only one person allowed in the bathroom at a time • bedroom doors remain wide open when more than one child is in the room • individual's bedrooms are off limits to other children • additional supervision when more than one child in a room	Care providers will assure that any alcohol/medications in the home are not accessible to the child.
Other	Caregivers provided after hours number to contact if crisis arises.	Child will not be alone with male care provider Male care provider will not transport child on his own. Strategic Seating: caregivers will assure child does not travel in car next to other vulnerable children; will be in caregivers' view.	Caregivers will maintain knowledge of where and with whom the child is associating. Caregivers will provide therapeutic tools (stress ball, soothing music, etc.) as requested by therapist.
