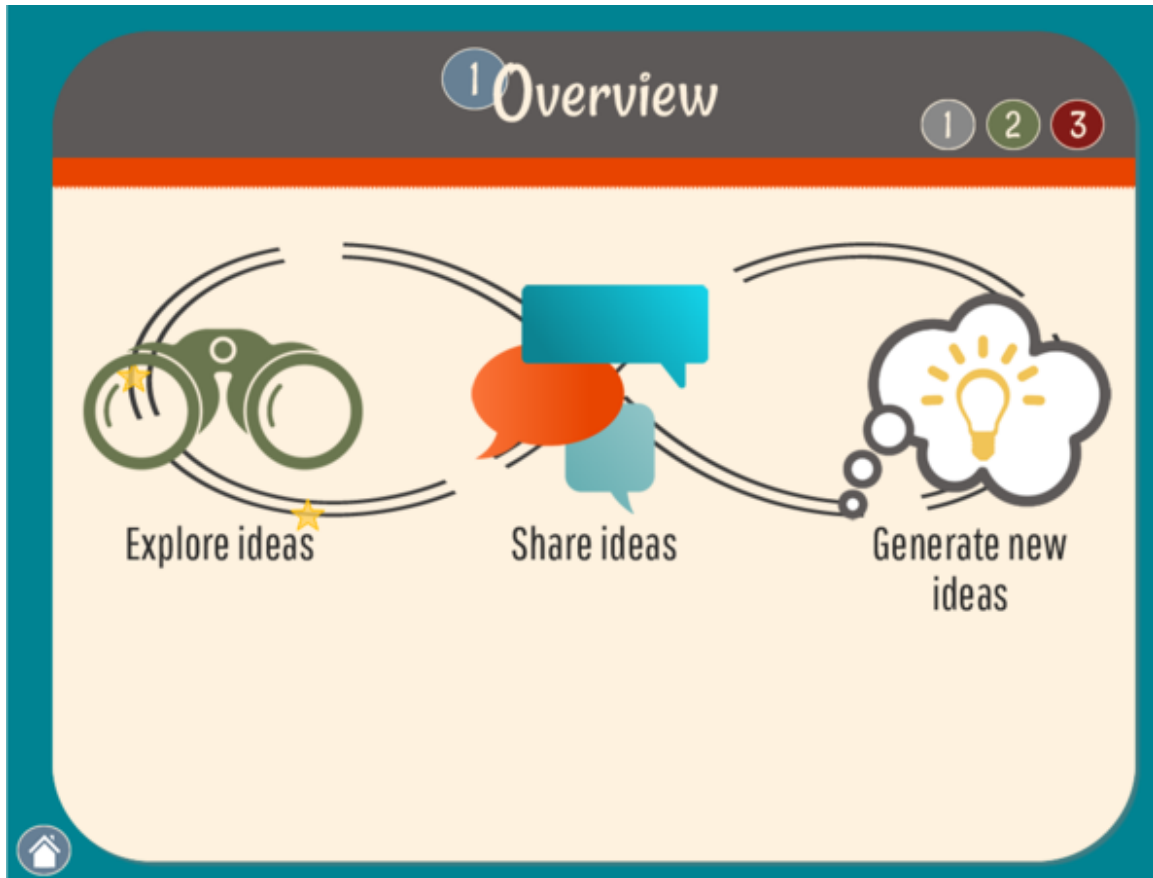

By the end of seminar, you'll have new ideas to contemplate and strategies to take back to the office!

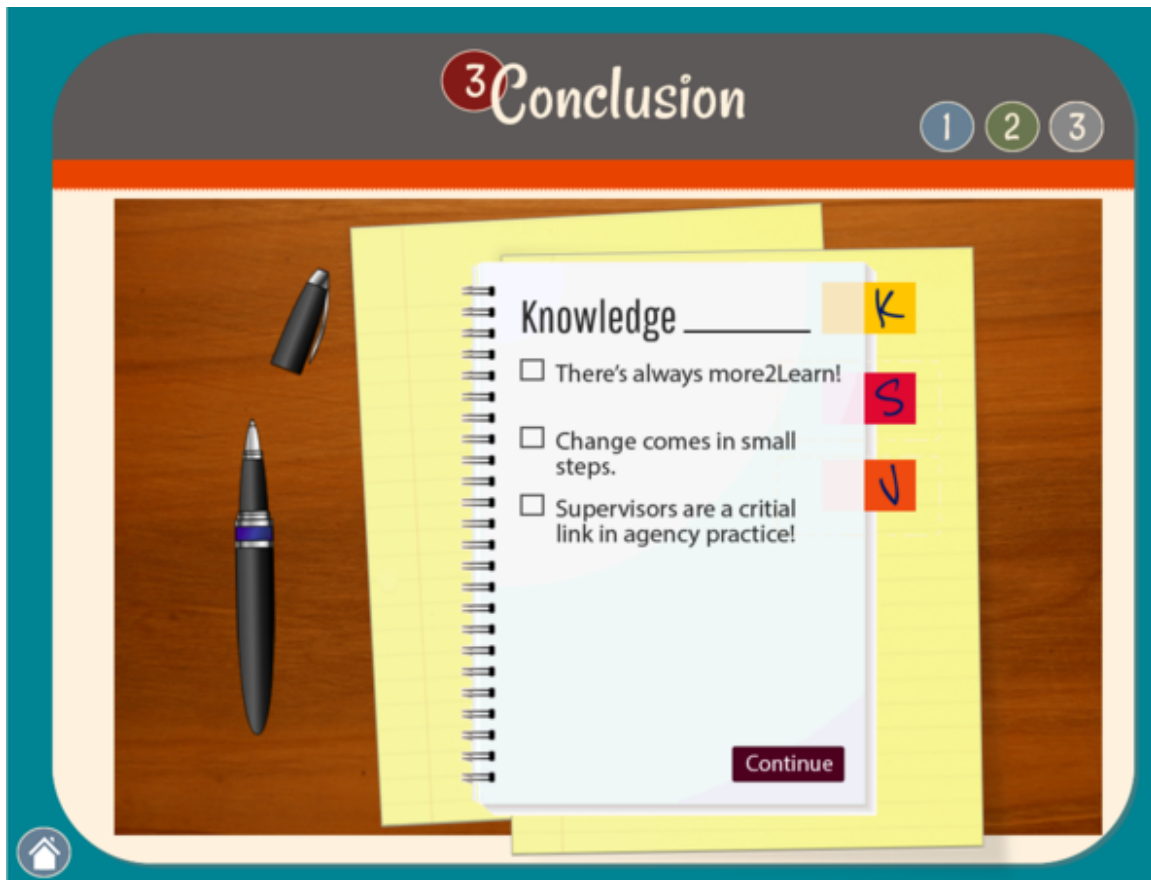
