

CANVAS DISTANCE LEARNING PLATFORM INFORMATION

Canvas trainings are self-paced courses that use a blend of activities, quizzes, and discussion in the Canvas platform. These courses will have a 7 day window of completion. Users will be actively engaged with other participants and trainers throughout the course.

Canvas System Requirements:

VILT- VIRTUAL INSTRUCTOR LEAD (ZOOM) DISTANCE LEARNING PLATFORM INFORMATION

Zoom trainings are performed using video chat software to actively engage participants during a 3 hour class period. Participants are expected to engage with video and audio discussions and multiple tools will be used to encourage participation throughout the session. You should expect to participate live, on camera, for the entire training as scheduled.Be aware that some of the images and discussions during class are extremely sensitive, can be triggering, and are inappropriate for children. Please ensure that no children are exposed to the content during this class.

- Live meeting done in real time w/ instructor & other participants.
 Participants are expected to engage w/ video & audio discussions throughout the training.
 - This format most resembles the classroom experience.
- Participants must have access to a computer or smart device, reliable internet connection, webcam & microphone. Telephones can be used as an alternative for audio, but are not recommended for video & other Zoom features.
 - Computers provide the best user experience & are preferred.
 - Participants are expected to access handouts electronically through an emailed provided link.
 - To receive credit for the class participants must attend the full training.
- Due to the sensitivity of discussions & images during class, participants should ensure children are not exposed to the content. Parents should make arrangements for childcare if necessary.
- Both parents need to be registered in PDS
 - Both parents can attend together using a shared device

CANVAS

Self-Paced Training

Indicated in PDS "TITLE- Distance Learning"

- Self-paced coursework done anytime w/in the training window. Participants move through lecture, participate in discussions & complete assignments & other virtual interaction w/ instructor & participants.
- This is a great option for those whose schedule doesn't allow them to participate in a live class or have barriers in using Zoom.
- A unique email address is required for each participant. Parents in the same family are able to work through the course together however, each needs a separate Canvas account & provide unique answers in assignments.
- Although trainers provide support & are available for assistance, some online skill is needed (clicking on tabs/completing online documents).
 - Reading & writing is required.
 - Training title in PDS will be (normal title)-Distance Learning
 - Training location will be listed as "Canvas - Online Platform"
 - Both parents need to be registered in PDS
- Children should not be present during training

FOSTER PARENT FOUNDATION MODULE 1: PARTNERS IN PERMANENCY

Format

Introduces the parent or caregiver to the primary goals of child protective services and how these services can help achieve protection and permanence for children and their families. The parent or caregiver is introduced into his or her role as a member of the team and how collaboration with caseworkers, the child protection agency and other professionals is imperative to serving the child, birth family and foster parent. The importance of advocacy for the child is also emphasized as the best interest of the child needs to be considered during case planning, with schools and other service agencies/providers.

FOSTER PARENT FOUNDATION MODULE 5: IMPACT OF MALTREATMENT Format ON CHILD DEVELOPMENT

Describes the impact of maltreatment on a child's development, including outlining typical child development in the five developmental domains, as well as developmental delays that are associated with the different forms of abuse and neglect. Parents or caregivers will learn about resources to address developmental delays. In addition, parents or caregivers will understand that children will experience differing degrees of traumatization due to their resiliency factors, and will also need to learn life skills differently due to their abuse histories.







Street Drugs of Abuse

The training will identify current street drugs of abuse; include an overview of addiction; discuss feelings of progression; include relevant statistics, relevant drugs of abuse (methamphetamine, methcathinone, ecstasy, over the counter drugs, prescription drugs, and other relevant drugs); how to recognize and detect street drug abuse; the pharmacology of individual drugs; will include neurotransmitter and brain research as it relates to street drug abuse; and treatment practicality.

The Institute for Child and Family Well-being is now offering a comprehensive, evidence-informed training experience that provides:

A foundational understanding of adverse childhood experiences (ACEs), toxic stress, and its impacts on brain development, behavior, and health outcomes;
 The Brain Architecture Game, an evidence-informed, experiences training in which participants engage in the building of a brain as it experiences traumatic, stressful and

participants engage in the building of a brain as it experiences traumatic, stressful and supportive events;

-A foundational understanding of how protective and supportive caregivers and communities may mitigate the impacts of ACEs and toxic stress and build resilience and executive functioning and emotional regulation in children;

The Child Adult Relationship Enhancement (CARE) training, an evidence-informed intervention that can be used by any adult who interacts with children;

-CARE teaches specific skills that promote positive interactions and enhanced relationships between children and the adults in their lives.

-CARE involves two phases: First, following the child's lead to build a strong relationship, and second, giving effective directions to help improve compliance.

-CARE can be generalized to a wide variety of providers and settings.

-CARE promotes child, family, and community resilience.

-Access to the Institute for Child and Family Well-being's Community of Practice, which provides ongoing consultation, tools and resources, and engagement with a broader trauma-informed and trauma-responsive community.
